Our own Carbine Club cricket 'Tragic', past president Ian Hollindale, was on hand to do the honours in the absence of cricket's renowned journalist Robert 'Crash' Craddock.

CARBINE CLUB OF SOUTH AUSTRALIA- VALE MAX HALL OAM

The Carbine Club of South Australia lost one of its Life Members and colourful characters Max Hall OAM overnight on the 17th December, 2014 in the Mary Potter Hospice, North Adelaide at the age of 85 years.

Max Had been a Member from 1990 up until the time of his passing and this period included 18 years on the Committee.

He always upheld the ideals of The Carbine Club and attempted to ensure that others did as well, and although not always successful he maintained his push for Carbine Club correctness until his last few weeks.



Max, pictured left in his Channel 9 days, was a South Australian Football Hall of Famer, inducted in 2007, and a Grand Final umpire who left a legacy for his umpiring – 80 games from 1953-1956, but more so because of his influence in modernising and growing the game as a commentator on SA Radio and Channel 9 alongside other great SA Football names.

Max not only had interest in The Carbine Club and football, he was also highly regarded in the thoroughbred racing industry, in particular with the SAJC and Oakbank Racing Club.

Recently retired SANFL former Chief Executive and CCSA Life Member Leigh Whicker said that football had lost a thorough gentleman adding that as an umpire he was South Australia's representative in the National Carnival and he was nationally highly regarded.

Max had a long battle with cancer, but he never flinched in his endeavours to combat his condition.

Max Hall OAM will be missed by so many people but none more so than his regular table of guests at the Carbine Club luncheons.

He is survived by his beloved wife Valmai of 61 years and his extended family.

CARBINERS IN THE NEWS - SIR DON ROWLANDS, KNZM, OA, CBE

The New Year's Honours list saw Don Rowlands appointed a Knight Companion of the New Zealand Order of Merit in recognition of his services to business and rowing.

Sir Don was managing director and chief executive of Fisher & Paykel Appliances, the first chairman and a longstanding director of Mainfreight as well as serving on the board of several other major companies. He was inducted into the New Zealand Business Hall of Fame in August 2014 for his leadership and governance skills. His leadership also extended to sport, following on from his own rowing successes



(which included gold and silver medals at the British Empire Games and nine New Zealand rowing titles), he has been very much involved in the sport as selector, manager, chair of the 1998 World Rowing Championship organising committee and has played an integral role in the development, maintenance and management of Lake Karapiro as a world class rowing venue.

Just prior to Christmas, Sir Don was also awarded the Order of Australia, Honorary Member General Division 2014 for his 'significant contributions to Australian rowing through the generous contribution of his knowledge and time'. He was acknowledged for 'his enormous contribution to the development of rowing and as the architect of the extraordinary international success which rowers from Australia have enjoyed over the last 50 years.' He was appointed as representative for Australia and New Zealand to the world body of rowing (FISA) in 1974 and held that position until 1992. He was a voluntary advisor to the development of rowing courses in Australia, including the 1990 World Rowing Championship course and the 2000 Sydney Olympic Games course.

Congratulations Sir Don. It is great to see your outstanding contribution to business and sport recognised on both sides of the Tasman.
