CCNZ Carbiner Catriona Williams in Queen's Birthday Honours

Catriona Williams (pictured) was appointed a member of the New Zealand Order of Merit in the Queen's Birthday Honours for her services to spinal cord injury research.

Catriona is a former NZ representative in both show jumping and eventing who was left a tetraplegic after a riding accident in 2002. She founded the Catwalk Spinal Injury Trust to support researchers in finding a cure for spinal cord injuries.

Her Trust has raised over \$3.5 million to date led by Catriona's efforts which include leading a handcycle trek from Tibet to Nepal via the Everest base camp and completing the New York Marathon on a handcycle.
