As usual the luncheon was started off robustly by our silver-tongued Master of Ceremonies Murray Burton who once again prepped the guests for what would again be a terrific luncheon.

He emphasized his many lifelong friendships that have been forged through rugby since that tour, saying that contrary perhaps to popular expectation, many of his best mates were English!

Members and Guests were then entertained by the hilarious Austin Knight who hails from Manchester.

The lunch raised about HK\$ 220,000 in donations for The Hong Kong Football Charitable Trust.
