Carbine Club of NSW Life Member Ken Page passed away on 24 October leaving a huge gap in the ranks – Ken was well known in the Carbine Club community and with his wife Heather by his side Ken attended every one of the 14 Carbine Club International Congresses held to date.

As well as being a Life Member of the Club Ken also held office as Chairman and was a long time Secretary; his dedication to sport saw him awarded the Order of Merit by the New South Wales Olympic Committee in 2006, he was a Chairman of the Commonwealth Games Fundraising Committee of NSW and a member of the Olympic Games Fundraising Committee of NSW.

Ken made a significant contribution to horse racing too – he was Managing Director of Adam Thoroughbreds Pty Ltd and in his working life as a senior member of the NSW TAB, the "Jolly Green Giant" as it was then, Ken was well known as a media spokesman and he also was the Australian representative to the Horse Racing Hall of Fame in Saratoga, USA.

Ken's contribution to the Carbine Club at so many levels and over many years was enormous, hence the acknowledgment in the award of Life Membership. He gave new meaning to the words "true gentleman" and he Heather forged many friendships across the wider club – he will be sadly missed.

Special Notice - The Carbine Club International Congress

Due to the reduced number of registrations received by the deadline of 30 September 2021, the Carbine Club of South Australia's Congress Organising Committee has re-scheduled the Congress and is now planning for the Congress to be held in October 2022 - the dates are October 6th to 11th.

Apart from the small number of registrations received for May 2022 (49) the CCSA Organising Committee has the following reasons for making this change:

- When the Adelaide Congress was originally scheduled for May 2020, we received over 140 registrations this demonstrated that the event was popular amongst Members worldwide and should go ahead if at all possible
- Requiring Members to commit for May 2022 meant that a great deal of doubt surrounding Covid-19 still existed
 in people's minds. Uncertainty still exists to this day with matters such as lockdowns, quarantine requirements,
 airline bookings, etc.
- By deferring the Congress registration date the uncertainty brought about by Covid-19 will be largely removed.

CONGRESS PROGRAMME OF EVENTS

The CCSA Congress Organising Committee has started negotiations with the various venues included in the Congress Programme and it is our belief that any revisions will be finalised by the end of October 2021.

There are 2 obvious changes forced upon the Committee:

- 1. AFL Fixture given the 2022 AFL season will be completed by October this event cannot be included. However, several ideas are being considered to provide for a memorable Congress function to be held at the Adelaide Oval
- 2. Goodwood Day at Morphettville a "day at the Morphettville Races" will remain in the Programme, Saturday, October 8, 2022. Screens in the Leilani Room at Morphettville will allow delegates to watch Spring Carnival Races while still taking in the glamour of the Morphettville race meeting.

If any other changes to the Congress Programme are forced upon the Organising Committee, the revised events will still be exciting and memorable.

Les Carlyon needs no introduction to racing fans, and he was a noted speaker at Club functions over the years.



Brilliant and original

AT THE CARBINE CLUB lunch before the Melbourne Cup, Andrew Peacock told two stories about Menzies and against himself. After the young Peacock had delivered a speech, Menzies told the beaming lad it was "brilliant and original". The only trouble, Sir Robert said, was the brilliant bits weren't original and the original bits weren't brilliant.

Later, having taken over Menzies' seat of Kooyong, Peacock showed Menzies a draft of his maiden speech. Menzies told him: "The English is very good but the speech is too long. I'd cut it in half—and it doesn't matter which half."
