
Claudia won 1 individual gold, 3 Individual silver and 6 team gold medals.

OBITUARY - Jeffery (Jeff) Ellis ROBSON MBE

Sadly, one of the Carbine Club's founding members, Jeff Robson died on 5th September 2022 aged 95. Jeff was an outstanding athlete at both badminton and tennis and is one of only three people to represent New Zealand internationally in both codes.

At badminton, he won nine New Zealand singles championships, seven national men's doubles titles and four mixed doubles titles as well as winning internationally and made his mark as an administrator at the highest level. As a tennis player, he won the New Zealand men's singles title three times, five national men's doubles titles and two mixed doubles

championships representing New Zealand in the Davis Cup competition for three years and its captain for 10 years. This was achieved while continuing his professional career as a dentist. In 1976 he was appointed a Member of the Order of the British Empire and in 1990 was inducted into the New Zealand Sports Hall of Fame recognising an outstanding contribution to sport.

Vale Dr Allen Aylett OBE

Members of The Carbine Club in Melbourne and other Clubs throughout the Carbine network were deeply saddened by the recent passing of Dr Allen Aylett OBE, aged 88.

Allen Aylett exemplified the ethos of The Carbine Club: for sport and good fellowship, like no other. He joined the Club in 1976, served as club president and became the inspirational leader of the International Congress. He was made a Life Member in 2010.

A highly talented sportsman he represented Victoria in both football and cricket, winning many accolades over his lengthy playing career. Arguably this was matched or even exceeded by his time as an Administrator, as President of the VFL/AFL and of his beloved North Melbourne Football Club. His dear wife Marj, known to so many of us, was by his side to the end, along with the Aylett family.

The Carbine tradition is carried on by their son Rick, himself a member of several years standing. Vale Allen.

Current Carbine Club International Congress Chairman Lloyd Meredith also paid tribute to Allen and had this to say:

"I knew Allen as the founder and driver of the Congress and clearly understand why he is the reason it continues to this day to be a highlight of The Carbine Club calendar.

Allen was always quick to give credit to Brian Dixon as the creator of the Congress concept, but even Brian readily agrees that Allen was responsible for hitting on the formula which insured the longevity of the Congress. It revolved around 2 key factors: fraternity and education.

A little-known fact is that at every Congress Allen carried a list of all delegates and he ensured he spent time with every single one during each Congress. Along with my wife Jan I am deeply indebted to Allen when he arranged that I take over the reins to Chair each Congress since 2008 and we cherish the many memories of fun times at and between Congresses—"sensational" times, all laced with Aylett humour".

Apart from his stellar career as a sportsman in both cricket and football, and his tremendous input to football as an administrator, a little-known fact is that Allan also had an impact on the administration. of horse racing in Australia – some years ago when the then national ruling peak body of thoroughbred racing was looking to adopt a more contemporary governance model Allen freely shared some ideas to the group that had been charged with investigating proposals and the Australian Racing Board (now morphed into Racing Australia) was formed.


