OBITUARY - Gordon William John DRYDEN

Sadly, Gordon Dryden, another of the Carbine Club's founding members died peacefully on 26th September 2022 aged 91. Gordon was President of the Club from 1978-1980 and served on the Committee from the Club's inception in 1971 until 1982, then again from 1986-88 and 2010-11. Gordon started out as a journalist and was one of the founders of Radio Pacific, the first talkback radio station before becoming well for his commentaries on radio and television. He later moved into public relations, business and publishing and co-wrote books on learning and the future of learning which sold millions of copies worldwide. Although Gordon spent much time travelling following his move from broadcasting, he supported the Club and its activities whenever in New Zealand.



# From the Carbine Club Archives......

# Lunch with the Prince of Wales .. now King Charles III

In 2011 prominent Carbiner Robin Flannery compiled the Club booklet "Carbine Club Classics" and the following story, reproduced from the publication, telling of a visit by the then Prince Charles was penned by our own Carbine Club classic in Trevor Craddock:

# PIÈCE de RÉSISTANCE By TREVOR CRADDOCK

I was chuffed to provide the foreword for this assortment of stories and before the sun sets on it I'll sneak in a tale about The Carbine Club's ultimate Guest of Honour: His Royal Highness Prince Charles, Prince of Wales, who at that time was in his early thirties. It was 1981 when, instead of giving a speech, the Guest of Honour

answered questions off the cuff from members and guests, and everything was "in club".

The story of this accomplishment might be helpful to our sister clubs in seeking royalty or other government-sponsored VIPs.

On hearing of the Prince's proposed visit, I contacted the Department of Protocol of our government who advised me there was only one opportunity in his itinerary to attend a luncheon, and we would need to make a submission to them giving reasons why we should be selected. We did not have as high a profile in those days but elected to "gild the lily" a bit and indicate the variety of internationally known sports people who were members and the unique style of our meetings.

The venue would be Leonda by the Yarra, a function centre heralded as the "most modern in Australia" when it opened in 1971. Leonda was the former Hawthorn Tea Gardens, considered in my youth to be an integral part of courtship rituals. We would ferry down the Yarra and spend the day canoodling in canoes and hired rowing boats.

Now, back to the royal yarn.

Ultimately it came down to a contest between Melbourne Rotary and ourselves and after we were selected I had to go to Leonda – where we were limited to forty tables of ten – to go through every detail of arrival and procedure. Prince Charles agreed to the idea of questions in club but wanted a list in advance. His Highness

adhered to this request but on the day there was not time to get through them all. He was not selective and also not pleased that he had to leave us for elsewhere. The frankness with which he spoke impressed everyone.

The only downside was that one of the members' guests – we believed to be a politician – spoke to a reporter. As early as breakfast time next morning the Prince's aide was on the phone to me. I apologised sincerely, saying truthfully that this was the first time it had happened in our twenty years.


