
Queensland - Racing Luncheon

CCNZ - Colin Jillings

Colin Jillings, a member of the Club since 1985 and well known in horse racing circles on both sides of the Tasman, passed away on 23 December aged 91. He started his career in racing as a jockey winning his first race at the tender age of 13, winning and placing in Group races before turning to training. Colin Best known in Australia as the trainer of Cox Plate winner Phantom Chance, he won many of the majors in NZ including 4 Auckland Cups and the Great Northern NZ Derby 5 times.

CCNZ - Sir Patrick Hogan, KNZM, CBE

Sir Patrick Hogan, a member of the Club since 2013, died on 6 Jan 2023, aged 83.

Sir Patrick established the Cambridge Stud in 1977 and developed it into a world class breeding operation with his foundation sire Sir Tristram siring a then record 45 Group 1 winners which included 3 Melbourne Cup winners. Sir Tristram's son Zabeel continued the legacy, siring 47 Group 1 winners at his death (including 3 Melbourne Cup winners) both horses only standing in New Zealand making their achievements more remarkable. Between them the two horses sired the winners of 490 stakes races, not only being leading sires and broodmare sires themselves multiple times, but leaving progeny that have gone on to become champion stallions and broodmare sires, amongst them Octagonal, Savabeel and Lohnro. Sir Patrick's astute judgement of horseflesh and his business acumen took thoroughbred breeding to a new level and he was knighted in 1999 for his services to thoroughbred racing and inducted into both New Zealand and Australian Racing Halls of Fame. The breeding dynasty he established is a remarkable legacy to New Zealand's bloodstock industry.

CCQLD - Barry Round

CCQLD Special member Barry Round died on 24 Dec 2022. His achievements in AFL football are legendary – following his AFL debut with Footscray in 1969 he amassed 328 games, playing with Footscray and the Sydney Swans. His highest individual honour came in 1981 when he finished atop the leaderboard of the Brownlow Medal alongside Bernie Quinlan.

Barry was a Life Member of the AFL, Sydney Swans and Williamstown (where he played 110 games to finish off his playing career).

CCNSW - Phil Coles AM

CCNSW Senior Member Phil Coles passed away on 28 Jan 2023. A long term member and supporter of the Club, Phil was an Olympic canoer who competed at the 1960, 1964 and 1968 Olympic games. As well as being a long term member of the International Olympic Committee and on the executive board of the Australian Olympic committee from 1973, he was made a member of the Order of Australia in 1973 and was a Hall Of Fame inductee in 1993.
