Former Australian Test Cricketer Kerry O'Keeffe was the special guest speaker at the Carbine Club of Tasmania Luncheon at the Blundstone Arena Function Centre, Bellerive on Friday May 12. The leg spin Bowler who played 24 test matches for his country between

1971 and 1977, had the crowd in stitches at the 'Lunch with Skull' event which attracted more than 120 people.

Although very proud of his on-field appearances for the Australian Men's Test Cricket Team, Kerry is better known for his post-playing career as a commentator on ABC Radio, Triple M and Fox Sports. His quick wit, inane sense of humour and trademark 'distinctive' laugh had the luncheon guests entertained from start to finish.

The Carbine Club Tasmania which continues to raise funds to help young Tasmanian to pursue their sporting dreams teamed up with Taverners Tas (aka Lords Taverners) to present the event, helping to raise awareness for their work assisting those with disabilities to participate in sport.

A self-effacing Kerry 'Skull' O'Keeffe spoke about his playing days, his teammates, humorous incidents and some of the most famous cricketers including the batsmen and bowlers he holds in the highest regard.

Carbine Club member Damon Wise thanked Kerry for his entertaining presentation and presented him with a bottle of Tasmanian Single Malt Whisky in appreciation of his appearance.

Leith Putland recently retired from office bearing roles with the Club in WA after long and distinguished service including time as a committeeman, President, and Secretary, and he was a much-valued member of "The Carbiner" Correspondents team. He was awarded Life Membership of the Club in recognition of his efforts over the years.

Leith is well known to the wider Club fraternity ensuing from his deep involvement which includes being in the role of President at the Congress held in WA a few years ago, and his attendance at Congress and Club events across the board.



## **NZ-Vicky Latta**

Another long serving office bearer to recently retire is Vicky Latta from NZ. CCNZ Vice President Fiona Allan sent through this info:

VICKY LATTA has been instrumental in the development of the Carbine Club of New Zealand.

She has always loved horses and owned her first pony when she was 10. She represented NZ in eventing from 1987 to 1996 including two World Equestrian Games and two Olympic Games.

Vicky competed at the Barcelona 1992 Olympic Games winning a Silver medal in the teams event and was 4th individually and at the Atlanta 1996 Olympic Games winning a Bronze medal in the Teams event.

Vicky was a successful lawyer before competing internationally and returned to the law after retiring from competition and after successfully managing the NZ eventing team from 1997-1999.

Vicky was one of the first women members of the Carbine Club elected as a Member in 2000, she was invited onto the Committee in 2009 and asked to take on the role of Secretary temporarily, however she continued in the role until this year. She was inducted as a Life Member in 2022.

Vicky was such a valuable Committee member. She was the main contact person for anything related with the Club, she prepared all the club's activities and events (and rallied all the members in advance of the events and activities), she prepared the committee meeting agendas and minutes, she maintained the website and submitted all the information from New Zealand for the Carbiner.

She really enjoyed participating in and contributing to the discussions at the Carbine Club Delegates' meetings and the Carbine Club Annual Dinner.

Vicky's 13 years of outstanding service as Secretary of the Carbine Club of New Zealand was acknowledged and celebrated at the Carbine Club of New Zealand AGM in April 2023.

PETER JEFFARES was also acknowledged as he stepped down following 10 years on the Committee, including 3 years as President.
